We also provided counseling for marriage, runaway children, and seasonal migrants, as well as STDs prevention services. Supervised two staff members, an office secretary and a midwife.

1993-1994 "Community Nutrition Program" Dakar, Senegal

MD and Trainer

Financed by the World Bank, the program was aimed at the eradication of malnutrition through education of the general public. Directed the training of community health workers in early detection of malnutrition in children and pregnant women. Participated in the design and implementation of the program in its pilot phase in three different regions of Senegal (Dakar and Suburbs, Thies and Louga).

Elaborated a training manual for low level educated community health worker to communicate and counsel illiterate pregnant women in good nutrition practice using locally available and cheap crops.

"Evaluation of the Global Immunization Plan of 1998"

Provided technical support of evaluators, helped in the national cluster sampling and designing the survey. In 3 weeks we surveyed more than 50 villages in very remote areas with limited food and clean water. It was a very challenging experience physically and emotionally.

Survey of Medical Services effectiveness of management

Participated in the development of a retrospective study and audit of private medical clinics vs. public institutions (Hospitals, University Hospitals, and Women's Clinics) in assessing efficiency and adequacy of medical care. Directed the assessment of adequacy of prescriptions and diagnostic investigations. This comparative study was the cornerstone of the semi-privatization of public hospitals. We realized that private practices did not mean better medical care, and as a matter of policy the regional medical director was empowered to keep track of the performance of private health care providers.
